## SO WHAT IS THE CONSERVATION AREA NAME?

There is still no official name for the conservation area on Kolombangara above 400m altitude.

The competition to find a Nduke name was very popular. KIBCA received 130 entries. They contained many old stories about Kolombangara and its culture. Most people were happy to give the conservation area a new name, but some were not. There was confusion that KIBCA was renaming existing features like Mt Rano or even Kolombangara Island. This was never the plan. Since the naming was sensitive, the KIBCA Executive decided to delay the naming until October 2011 and do more awareness meetings with Kolombangara people.

#### THE NEW KIBCA LOGO

viewed from near Gizo. This outline reveals Nina Goele, the sleeping woman, that has deep cultural meanings to the Dughore people of Kolombangara.

The version in colour is green like the forests, with blue at the bottom representing the sea and red at the top, showing a sunset over the mountain.

The logo was designed by former Ringgi resident, Joe Fairlamb, now living in Adelaide.

### PM DEDICATES KOLOMBANGARA CONSERVATION AREA. LARGEST IN SOLOMONS

Solomon Islands Prime Minister, Danny Philip, has

backed Kolombangara landholders at the Kolombangara Festival last week, as he pledged to support the island's 400m conservation area.

In the first visit by a Prime Minister to Kolombangara Island, Prime Minister, Danny Philip, officially dedicated the 20,000 ha Kolombangara conservation area, the

largest in Solomon Islands. He said, "It is a wonderful idea to

demark a special area for

conservation". He said it was "a landmark action that the people of Kolombangara garem."

"In the midst of logging and environmental destruction you have the courage to have a conservation area."


Ferguson Vaghi, KIBCA coordinator, said, "It is now clear that there is broad support for our conservation area above 400m."

"KIBCA is also pleased that the Government said it was close to finalizing the Protected Areas Act that might be an important way to support our conservation area. If there is landholder support after our awareness program and the Government is ready, we hope to be the first to use the new legislation," said Mr Vaghi.

After the official welcome and speeches the Prime Minister visited Imbu Rano Lodge, a specially built lodge for scientific research and tourists on the edge of the conservation area.



The 20,000 ha Kolombangara conservation area, in the centre of Kolombangara above 400m, is the largest in the Solomon Islands.

#### **HONEY TRAINING PROGRAM**

KIBCA is organizing workshops to train village representatives on how to set up a honey project. There will be one workshop in the north of Kolombangara (15-19 Aug) and another in the south (in Oct). Those trained will be able to borrow a set of specialist honey-making equipment from KIBCA.

The project is a collaboration between KIBCA and the Western Province's Agricultural Department. Equipment is provided by a grant from WWF Melanesia.

This is a good example of the helpful partnerships KIBCA often has between community-based organisations, government and industry.
